Learning across the school

Nursery

The children in nursery have been thinking about Autumn this week, as part of their home learning the children have been enjoying Autumn walks with their families to collect conkers, pinecones and different coloured leaves. They have been using these Autumn goodies to support their learning, talking about the different colours we see and the days getting colder and darker. The children have created some lovely pictures of squirrels and hedgehogs and enjoyed conker rolling in the paint.

Reception: Robins

This week the Robins have been working on numbers to 5. They took their 'Five frames' out into the wooden area and collected 5 objects.



Year 1: Jays

Jays have been looking at poetry in English, listening carefully for rhyming words and even finding rhyming words around the classroom! In Maths, they have been looking into the phrase 'fewer or more'. Are there more apples or bananas? In Art, the children have have started to explore Paintz online, creating an amazing artwork on a computer! Whilst in Geography, they have been singing the Continents song and placing these onto a map. Wow, what a busy week! \bigodot

Year 2: Kingfishers

In Science the Kingfishers explored where animals live in the woodland area. They predicted where different animals are likely to be found. The class explored these potential microhabitats, and they discussed their findings afterwards. The children were very enthusiastic about finding the animals, particularly the frogs!



Year 3/4: Woodpeckers

This week, Woodpeckers have been writing our own poems about feelings and emotions. They have been looking at examples of similes and alliteration and trying to use these in their own poems. In French they are continuing to learn new vocabulary. The children can greet each other by saying hello and goodbye in different ways, and now they have learnt French instructions for look, listen, read, write and repeat. Fantastique Woodpeckers!

Year 4/5: Swallows

This week the Swallows have worked hard to improve their understanding of place value, and have been rounding numbers of up to one million. They produced some beautiful leaf rubbings in art. Science saw them talking about the Earth and our universe, a topic the children really love. They have been continuing our play leader training in PE as well as playing hockey! The children have been writing some fantastic stories relating to ancient Greece. Fantastic work this week, Swallows!

Year 6: Herons

Herons have been looking at common factors, multiples and divisibility rules in Maths. They have started looking at a new text in English, 'Is unseasonable food becoming unsustainable?'. In Science they have looked at the symbols used in electricity and why we use symbols rather than drawings. In Geography the children continued their learning on the Tatra Mountains and looked at the pull factors which bring tourists to that area and the species which live at different elevations on Mount Rysy.

NSPCC Pantosaurus - 'PANTS' rule



Along with many schools across the country, at Hemsby Primary, we use the NSPCC Pantosaurus rule to help to teach children about keeping themselves safe. With the help of the friendly Pantosaurus dinosaur, adults, both at school and at home, can teach children about how to stay safe.

At a level appropriate for their own age, all children learn about how the parts of their bodies which are covered by their underwear are private parts and are not for other people to see or touch and how important it is to talk to someone about anything which upsets or worries them.

We will be revisiting the Pantasaurus rule in school next week.

Leave in Term Time

As a school, we are not allowed to authorise any requests for children to be taken out of school for a holiday during term time.

Requests for leave can only be granted in exceptional circumstances, and a holiday would not be considered exceptional. Requests for leave must also be made to the school in advance. To do this please come into the school office to complete the necessary Leave in Term Time application.

Parents may receive a penalty notice if their child is absent from school without permission. We appreciate the challenges that some parents face when booking holidays, particularly during the school holidays. However, regular attendance at school is vital in helping children and young people to achieve their full potential and get the best possible start in life.

If your child is unable to attend school due to illness, please call the school office on 01493 730364. If your child has a medical appointment during school time, please let the school office know in advance.

Free school meals and other support for pupils – here's what you need to know:

Hemsby Primary School is an inclusive school, and we work hard to support all children no matter their background. We know that some children are, however, more vulnerable than others or some may need greater support to help them be successful in school. We have additional support for children from disadvantaged backgrounds. This includes providing free school meals, special support during school holidays and providing extra funding to schools to support pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds and improve education outcomes.

Here's everything you need to know about the support we offer and how to access it.

Which children get free school meals and how do they access them?

We've significantly expanded access to free school meals in recent years. You can check your eligibility for free school meals below. Free school meals - Norfolk County Council

Not only does this entitle your child to free school meals, but you will also receive up to £240 per child, per year in supermarket vouchers to help with the rise in the cost of living. These vouchers will be paid up to and including March 2024, so it is important to check your eligibility as soon as possible.

'Let's Talk About...'

This academic year, as a part of our work both in implementing the DFE's revised Reading Framework and our own curriculum development, the development of oracy skills will be a focus across our school. We will seek to ensure that all pupils have the opportunity and support to become fluent, confident and skilled communicators.

Each week on our newsletter, there will be a 'Let's Talk About...' a topic/theme to promote conversation and discussion at home.

Let's Talk About...Inventions!

This is a great oracy activity to really stimulate the imagination. We never fail to be impressed and astonished at some of the incredible ideas and solutions that children come up with when asked to invent something that will solve a problem or make something easier. For this task, ask your child to first draw or model their invention and then talk you through it.

Some questions to ask, either in advance or when your child goes through their invention are:

What problem did you want to solve?

- How does this solve it?
- Who will it be most useful for?
- What/who will you need to make it?
- How much will it cost to make?
- Is there anything similar out there?
- Are there any variations or adaptations you could add?

Please do encourage your child to bring their design into school and chat with me about it.


