Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for supporting our Harvest Service in St Mary's Church this week. It was lovely to be able to share this experience with you all. A big thank you from all the Hemsby team for your donations for our local community. As there were so many generous donations, we will also be making donations to Martham Food Bank.

It was lovely to see parents and carers attend the Robins Story Café this week.

This week we have welcomed our new caretaker to the Hemsby Team. Mr Steve Baxter joined us on Tuesday this week. I am sure that you will make Mr Baxter feel very welcome when you see him out and about on the school site.

Children may bring a bottle of water to school to keep in the classroom and access when necessary. Please label bottles clearly with your child's name and class. There is also access to water fountains should children not have their water bottle. We politely ask that no energy drinks such as 'Prime' are sent into school. Thank you for understanding.

As part of being a healthy school, we encourage children to walk, scoot or cycle to school. Scooter and cycle racks are available for children to leave their scooters and bikes during the day. For safety reasons, we ask that when on school site, scooters and bikes are pushed rather than ridden so that no none is accidentally biked into.

It is very important that we ensure the safety of all children, parent/carers and our neighbours at dropping off and pick up times. We ask that everyone parks safely and considerately, avoiding the yellow zig-zag lines and not blocking any driveways or creating a hazard.

Please could we kindly ask that all children are fully supervised at the beginning and end of the school day when bringing children to school and exiting from school at the end of the day. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Please can you ensure that children do not wear earrings on the days they have PE or in the event of newly pierced ears, for the parent/carer to cover them with medical tape to prevent them from causing injury. School staff will not be able to apply/remove tape. Thank you for your cooperation.

Thank you so much to those parents/carers who have already spoken with me about becoming part of our volunteer team here at Hemsby. Your support for our school is so greatly appreciated. We will be launching our Volunteer Team after half term. We are still looking for more volunteers, so please do have a chat with me if you think you are able to support in school with activities such as reading or times table practice.

# This Week.....


Nursery: This week the Nursery children have been talking about 'Space'. They have been learning the songs '5 little men in a flying saucer' and 'zoom, zoom, zoom, we're going to the moon'. The children have enjoyed exploring moon sand and sensory trays and eating their star shaped snacks. They have also made some lovely handprint aliens. The highlight of the week seems to have been singing with the parachute, sending teddies to the moon!





Reception: In phonics, the Robins are working hard to 'Fred talk' and make words using magnetic letters. We have started taking Sound blending books home to practice with our grown-ups. In Maths, we are working on comparing groups of objects using the language of more and fewer. We performed the song Dingle, Dangle Scarecrow at the Harvest Festival service. Well done to everyone. We had out first story cafe, sharing our CUSP reading book, 'What Makes Me a Me?' A big thank you to all the parents/carers that came and made this event so successful.

Year 1: In the Jays this week, we have introduced a new book called, 'Where the wild things are' for English. We have been focusing on retrieving information, by looking at the pictures and asking questions along the way. I wonder where we are going. Then sequencing the events as they have happened.



In Maths, we have been looking at who has more or less cubes? Using the symbols, < (less than), > (more than) and = equal to, in and around the classroom. Miss Hartle has 2 cubes, but you have 5 cubes. Which number is greater? In Science we have begun to look at seasonal changes, can we name the four seasons, and describe how the weather might be for that time of the year?



Year 2: This week in English, the Kingfishers have been looking at a variety of rhyming poems and creating their own poems. In D&T, we have started to learn how to do a running stitch to create our own patchwork design.

Year 3/4: This week in Woodpeckers the children have been working hard on writing descriptive sentences to help build a clear picture in the readers head. In our English reading lessons, we have been reading non-fiction texts and looking at the meaning of new vocabulary.

Year 4/5: This week in Maths the Swallows have been working on column addition and subtraction as well as brushing up on their mental maths strategies. In English we have completed our extended stories that are set in Ancient Greece. In Science we are looking at the planets in our solar system and, in History we look at how the Ancient Greeks really did change our world with their ideas on things like democracy! We have also brushed up on how to say the days of the week and numbers to twenty in French. It has been a good week!

Year 6: This week the Herons have been looking at formal methods of multiplication. We are beginning to plan our own discursive pieces in English. In Science, we have hypothesised what would happen when we change certain variables in our electrical circuits and then tested those hypotheses.

### Let's Talk About

• This academic year, as a part of our work both in implementing the DFE's revised Reading Framework and our own curriculum development, the development of oracy skills will be a focus across our school. We will seek to ensure that all pupils have the opportunity and support to become fluent, confident and skilled communicators.

Each week on our newsletter, there will be a 'Let's Talk About...' a topic/theme to promote conversation and discussion at home.

Monday's school assembly this week gives us our 'Let's Talk About...' theme this week.



This week our focus for Monday's assembly was all about travel. We asked the question:

If you could travel anywhere in the world, where would it be?

Do spend some time chatting with your child about this.


