Each week on our newsletter, there will be a 'Let's Talk About...' a topic/theme to promote conversation and discussion at home.

Let's Talk About..... Activities you can do to support conversations with your child

## Activities you can do to support conversations with your child

Lots of children and young people find it easier to talk while doing an activity. This takes the pressure off because they don't have to sit still or make eye contact all the time, and because it makes pauses and silences more comfortable.

Having something to do with their hands, or something practical to focus on, can also make it easier for some children and young people to reflect or think more clearly.

Rather than feeling like a 'big chat', the conversation can start more naturally while you're both doing something you enjoy.

Try picking one of our activity ideas and giving it a go.

- Play a ball game. Football, catch, basketball, dodgeball ... there are endless ball games to choose from. You can ask your child to pick a game they'd like to play or ask them about their favourite sports team.
- Ready, set... bake. Baking is a great way to have fun together
  and there are so many bakes to choose from including with
  fairy cakes, scones, traybakes or energy balls.
- Create something together. There are so many things you
  can make in 20 minutes. This can be as simple as doing a paintby-numbers, jigsaw, designing your own Birthday or thank
  you cards, or trying something new like painting your own Tshirt designs.
- **Draw cartoons of each other.** Sometimes, all you need is pen and paper. Create cartoon drawings of one another, and other family members, cats, dogs, fish have fun! You could also try drawing with your eyes closed or not taking your pen off the paper to add an extra challenge.
- Indoor picnic. 20 minutes isn't quite enough time to head out to the beach with a picnic blanket, but it's perfect for having one indoors. Lay out a blanket, pick out your family's favourite finger food and have a picnic in the comfort of home.
- Tech-free games. Take a screen break with tech-free games like 20 questions, cat's cradle, marbles, jacks, the floor is lava, skipping and more. There are so many 20 minute games to choose from.

**Robins:** This week the Robins have been learning about Diwali, the Hindu festival of lights. We worked with clay to make diva pots. We used chalks outside on the playground to design our own Rangoli patterns. We created our own mendi designs on hands. We made finger puppets to act out the story of Rama and Sita.

In maths we have started working on 'one less.'







Jays: The Jays have been exploring our new booked called 'The Storm Whale', focusing on our questioning skills. Trying to remember that a question could start with who, where or when? In Maths, we have started to subtract two single digits from one another. Miss Hartle has 8 pencils and gave 3 away. How many does she have left? 8 - 3 =

In art, the children are experimenting with their brush strokes, from forming straight lines moving onto to curved lines using our primary colours.





**Kingfishers:** In Science this week we have been looking at lifecycles. We spoke about the lifecycles of a butterfly and a chicken. We compared the similarities and differences between these two lifecycles. We noticed that both of the adults lay eggs however a butterfly lays multiple eggs at once.



**Woodpeckers:** This week in Woodpeckers we have been going back in time to prehistory, learning about the different stages of the Stone Age. We have been handling an hand axe made from flint, finding out how these were made and how the oldest hand axe found in Europe was actually found in Happisburgh. We also learnt about being hunter gatherers, and spent some time outside researching which foods would have been safe for stone age people to gather and eat.

**Swallows:** This week the Swallows have been continuing to work on times tables problems in year four with the year 5's beginning work on fractions, and especially equivalent fractions. Our Science topic on Forces has started, with the class exploring how friction works. We have brushed up on our French greetings this week and have also looked at the birth of democracy in Ancient Athens and how it compares to democracy in the UK today. All in all it has been a very busy week!



**Herons:** This week in the Herons, we have been writing our first-person stories containing a moral. We have been learning about brackets and the order of operations in Maths. In Music we have started to get used to Band Lab software for creating music digitally. In RE we have finished off our unit on Christian, Islamic and Hindu views towards conflict and peace.





Swallows - Purple


