It is important that our children stay hydrated throughout the day and therefore they do require a water bottle, labelled with their name in school each day. As we promote healthy eating habits, we would ask that only water is brought in from home. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

My child has been ill - when should they come back to school?

This information is from the <u>NHS Choices website - 'Is my child too ill for school?'</u>. Please visit the NHS site for more information.

Not every illness needs to keep your child from school. If you keep your child away from school, be sure to inform the school on the first day of their absence. Whether you send your child to school will depend on how severe you think the illness is. Use this guidance to help you make that judgement. Remember: if you're concerned about your child's health, consult a health professional.

Please note: if you feel your child is well enough to be in school, they will be expected to participate in all curriculum activities, including PE and swimming.

- Vomiting and diarrhoea. Children with diarrhoea and/or vomiting should definitely be kept off school until
 at least 48 hours after their symptoms have gone. Most cases of diarrhoea and vomiting in children get better
 without treatment, but if symptoms persist, consult your GP. If we feel your child has come back to school too
 early, we will contact you.
- Cough and cold. A child with a minor cough or cold may attend school. If the cold is accompanied by a raised temperature, shivers or drowsiness, the child should stay off school, visit the GP and return to school 24 hours after they start to feel better. If your child has a more severe and long-lasting cough, consult your GP. They can give guidance on whether your child should stay off school.
- Raised temperature. If your child has a raised temperature, they shouldn't attend school. They can return 24 hours after they start to feel better.
- Rash. Skin rashes can be the first sign of many infectious illnesses, such as chickenpox and measles. Children
 with these conditions shouldn't attend school. If your child has a rash, check with your GP or practice nurse
 before sending them to school.
- Headache. A child with a minor headache doesn't usually need to be kept off school. If the headache is more
 severe or is accompanied by other symptoms, such as raised temperature or drowsiness, then keep the child
 off school and consult your GP.
- **Sore throat**. A sore throat alone doesn't have to keep a child from school. But if it's accompanied by a raised temperature, your child should stay at home.
- **Chickenpox**. If your child has chickenpox, keep them off school until all their spots have crusted over.

Class Stories

Nursery: It's been all about Fruit and Vegetables and Thanksgiving this week. The children have enjoyed learning the song One potato, two potato and printing with different types of fruit and vegetables, the children have learnt why we eat them as our 'Healthy choices'.

In maths we have been working on our subitising skills.













The children have then gone on to make their own 'save the whale' posters. In Maths we are continuing to explore subtraction within 10, using our part whole models to write a number sentence. In Geography, the children have located and named the four countries within the United Kingdom. Exploring and matching their flags too!





Kingfishers: This week in English we have been learning how to write an invitation. We looked at command and statement sentences. We also looked at using interesting adjectives in our writing. We have sent invitations home to our adults to invite them to come to the Nativity. The Kingfishers have worked very hard on their invitations. In Maths this week we started looking at sides and vertices of 2D shapes.


Woodpeckers: This week in Woodpeckers we have been reading a story set during the Iron Age. We have been spotting the historical references and thinking about planning our own stories set during the Stone Age, including some of the information we have been learning in our History lessons.

In French the children have been learning to express their emotions and feelings. These are the phrases we have been using:



Swallows: This week, the Swallows have worked incredibly hard in finishing their letters of application and then carefully editing them. We have worked hard in Maths both on our use of fractions and in practising multiplication. In Science we did some practical experiments to demonstrate air resistance and again showed our understanding of fair testing. We are coming towards the end of our topic on the Ancient Greeks and have looked at how the Greeks actually invented theatre!

It has been a great week in the Swallows.







Swallows - Purple


