Nursery: This week we have been learning about Bonfire Night in the Nursery. While we have been doing lots of fun activities and eating chocolate covered breadstick sparklers we have been talking about the importance of being safe; the children have been eager to feed back to staff that they need to wear gloves and hold sparklers away from their face, stay close to their families and stand away from the hot bonfires. We have all learnt a new song '5 little rockets standing in a row' and talked about the loud bangs and noises we might hear if we go to a fire work display. Robins: This week the Robins been thinking about Halloween which linked to our CUSP book, Pumpkin Soup. We carved a pumpkin then cut pumpkin to make our own pumpkin soup. In maths we have been investigating 2D shapes. We looked for shapes in the classroom and outside.








Jays: For English we are exploring 'Where the wild things are.' The children have begun to unpick the vocabulary, is there another word that is similar in meaning? Instead of saying fast, 'we could use quick!'In Maths we have finished off our part-whole model unit, exploring number bonds, what two numbers added together equal 10? 5+_=10 3+_=10 9+_=10. In science we have been investigating and questioning, how many hours are in a day? How does the Earth turn? And when it is daytime for us, it is night time for the other side of Earth!

The children have wowed Miss Hartle with their work this week!



Kingfishers: We've had a brilliant first week back. In Reading this week we have been reading Paddington. We've been using our inferring skills to find out how characters could be feeling using evidence from the book. We've also been using our summarising and retrieving skills too. In Maths we are continuing to add and subtract two-digit numbers. In Science, we have started looking at comparing animals and humans using our previous learning of MRS GREN.

Woodpeckers: It's been a great first week back with lots of learning taking place. We had fun learning about our skeletons in Science and naming the different bones in our bodies. In English we have been planning our own reports about eating a balanced diet, using our science knowledge about food groups. In French we are practising our numbers and using them to play a game.



Swallows: This week the Swallows have started a non-fiction unit in English on how to write persuasive letters and formal letters of application. In Maths, we are looking at multiplication and division, factors and multiples in year five and at area in year 5. We have been looking at the Greek myth of 'The Cyclops' in history and practised our basketball skills in PE. The children have returned to school full of energy this week and have really tried hard at everything.



Herons: In class this week, we have been looking at and practicing Remembrance poetry and had a go at planning and writing our own poems. In Maths we have been learning a method of long division. In History we have started our new topic which is about the Second World War and impact that American army bases had on our local area.

Remembrance


We will be walking, as a whole school, to the war memorial in the village, to pay our respects at this time of Remembrance during the morning of Tuesday 7th November.
